Vacant Properties Registration Ordinance

Inventory of approximately 1,500 boarded buildings, 1,200 residential

Vacant Properties Registration Ordinance
 Requires owners of vacant residential properties to register with City
 Escalating registration fees
 Owners who fail to register are subject to substantial fines

□ Became effective August 30, 2011



Vacant Properties Registration Ordinance

□ In Aug 2012, increased owner outreach:

- Targeted 169 "repeat" offenders
- 329 total properties registered to date
- 13 Renewals (at \$1,500 each)
- Total of \$187,000 collected to date
- ☐ Five Banks have paid a total of \$54,000

Four Property Management firms registered 168 properties

\$87,500 total collected
