Baltimore City Project Environmental

- Deconstruct 50 row house
- Salvage minimums
 - 3,000 brick
 - 1,000 BF lumber
 - 600 SF Flooring

Baltimore City Project Environmental

- Controlled debris
- Recycled debris
- Creation of Low Impact SWM

Baltimore City Project Financial

- Markets for material disposition
- Fee for service from City
- Creation of infrastructure to maximize other revenue streams

Baltimore City Project Infrastructure

- Cloud Based material tracking
- Manager of Material Disposition
- Temporary Aggregation sites
- Network of brokers and distributors

Baltimore City Project Transition to Urban Fall
