

# **HCDNNJ HouseNJ Legislative Update**

February 2023

## Streamlining Affordable Housing and Assistance Applications

- <u>S858/A2760</u> (Singleton/Reynolds-Jackson/Wimberly/McKnight)
- This directs the New Jersey Housing and Mortgage Finance Agency to create a single, common application that would be available on the New Jersey Housing Resource Center website.
- Passed Senate Community and Urban Development Committee. Passed Assembly Housing Committee. Next up: Assembly Appropriations

## Promoting community-based wealth

- <u>A793/S1427</u> (Timberlake/Tucker/Reynolds-Jackson/Gill)
- Creates a Community Wealth Preservation Program that would expand access expand access for certain buyers to purchase homes from sheriff's sales.
- Passed both Houses; conditionally vetoed by Gov. Murphy. Working with sponsorship on next steps.

## Eliminating the credit score standard for recipients of state and federal housing subsidies,

- <u>S934/A669</u> (Turner/Verrelli/Reynolds-Jackson)
- Prohibits landlords from considering credit scores when evaluating a prospective tenant.
- Next up: Hearings in Assembly Housing and Senate Community and Urban Development.

## Establishing Guardrails Against Discriminatory Appraisals of Residential Property Origin

- <u>S777/A1519</u> (Singleton/Pou/McKnight/Wimberly/Timberlake)
- Penalizes holders of appraisal licenses or certifications, or appraisal management company registrations if they have knowingly engaged in a discriminatory appraisal of a residential property.
- Passed Assembly Regulated Professions and Senate Community and Urban Affairs Committees. Next up: Assembly Housing

## **Expands Property Owner LLC Liability and Transparency**

- <u>S523/A3856</u> (Ruiz/Turner/Reynolds-Jackson/Wimberly/Timberlake)
- Allows courts to hold LLC managers, directors, and more, for housing, building, and health code.
- Passed Senate Community and Urban Affairs Committee; Next up: Assembly Housing Committee

## Statewide Code Red Requirements

- <u>S2429/A3540</u> (Codey/Lopez/Jimenez/McKnight)
- Creates Code Red requirements for counties based on the state's existing Code Blue requirements.
- Awaits hearings in Assembly Human Services Committee and in the Senate Health, Human Services and Senior Citizens Committee
